

MINUTES OF THE REGULAR MEETING OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF COLUMBIA,
ILLINOIS HELD MONDAY, MARCH 19, 2007 IN THE COUNCIL ROOM OF CITY HALL

I. CALL TO ORDER

Mayor Hutchinson called the City Council of Columbia, Illinois to order at 7:00 PM.

Upon Roll Call, the following members were:

The Council recited the Pledge of Allegiance.

II. APPROVAL OF MINUTES

The minutes of the Executive Session of the City Council held Monday, March 5, 2007 were submitted for approval.

MOTION:

It was moved by Alderman Niemietz, and seconded by Alderman Conrad, to approve the minutes of the Executive Session of the City Council held Monday, March 5, 2007, as on file at City Hall. Upon Roll Call vote, Aldermen Conrad, Agne, Niemietz, Unnerstall, Row, and Huch voted yea. Motion Carried.

The minutes of the Regular Meeting of the City Council held Monday, March 5, 2007 were submitted for approval.

Upon Roll Call vote, Aldermen Conrad, Agne, Niemietz, Unnerstall, Row, and Huch voted yea. Motion Carried.

III. DELEGATIONS

A. Land of Lincoln

Mr. Tom Rollins addressed the Council regarding the Land of Lincoln property.

Alderman Ebersohl arrived at 7:05 PM.
Alderman Koesterer arrived at 7:07 PM.

Mr. Tom Rollins informed the Council that he is one of the owners of the Land of Lincoln properties and that the clock on multi-family development for that property expires March 27, 2007. Mr. Rollins then explained that he is in negotiations with a party who develops retirement communities and is also working with an agent who specializes in office building developments. Mr. Rollins stressed that there is no contract with either party but negotiations are in the process.

B. Columbia Crossing Eminent Domain Discussion

1. Ordinance No. 2535 - Amend Master Development Agreement

MOTION:

It was moved by Alderman Huch, and seconded by Alderman Ebersohl, to pass Ordinance No. 2535, an ordinance authorizing a Second Amendment to a Master Development Agreement between the City of Columbia, Illinois and Columbia Crossing, L.L.C, a Missouri Limited Liability Company and to approve the form of the same. Upon Roll Call vote, Aldermen Conrad, Ebersohl, Agne, Niemietz, Unnerstall, Koesterer, Row, Huch, and Mayor Hutchinson voted yea. Motion Carried.

IV. REPORT OF OFFICERS

A. Administration Department

1. Columbia Chiropractic Family Fair Event

2. Sanitary Sewer Repairs - Accept Bids

It was moved by Alderman Conrad, and seconded by Alderman Ebersohl, to accept the low bid of \$16,825.00 as submitted by Walden Associated Technologies to line two sanitary sewer locations within the City of Columbia sewerage system. Upon Roll Call vote, Aldermen Conrad, Ebersohl, Agne, Niemietz, Unnerstall, Koesterer, Row, Huch, and Mayor Hutchinson voted yea. Motion Carried.

It was moved by Alderman Niemietz, and seconded by Alderman Agne, to accept the report of the Administration Department as presented. Upon Voice vote, all Aldermen present voted yea. Motion Carried.

B. Fire Department

The monthly report of the Fire Marshall was presented to the Council.

C. Police Department

F. City Attorney

1. Ordinance No. 2536 - Abatement of Methamphetamine Contamination

MOTION:

It was moved by Alderman Agne, and seconded by Alderman Koesterer, to pass Ordinance No. 2536, an ordinance requiring abatement of methamphetamine contamination of buildings or structures in the City of Columbia, Illinois. Upon Roll Call vote, Aldermen Conrad, Ebersohl, Agne, Niemietz, Unnerstall, Koesterer, Row, Huch, and Mayor Hutchinson voted yea. Motion Carried.

2. Ordinance No. 2537 - Amend Municipal Code - Water Meters

MOTION:

It was moved by Alderman Conrad, and seconded by Alderman Ebersohl, to pass Ordinance No. 2537, an ordinance requiring water meters in the City of Columbia, Illinois to be equipped with automatic read devices as required by the City. Upon Roll Call vote, Aldermen Conrad, Ebersohl, Agne, Niemietz, Unnerstall, Koesterer, Row, Huch, and Mayor Hutchinson voted yea. Motion Carried.

3. Ordinance No. 2538 - Briar Lakes Subdivision Infrastructure

MOTION:

It was moved by Alderman Unnerstall, and seconded by Alderman Row, to pass Ordinance No. 2538, an ordinance accepting ownership by dedication of the public streets, sanitary sewer system, water distribution system, and storm sewer system in the Briar Lake Estates Phase One and Phase Three Subdivisions in the City of Columbia, Illinois. Upon Roll Call vote, Aldermen Conrad, Ebersohl, Agne, Niemietz, Unnerstall, Koesterer, Row, Huch, and Mayor Hutchinson voted yea. Motion Carried.

4. False Alarm Assessment Bill

MOTION:

It was moved by Alderman Ebersohl, and seconded by Alderman Agne, to direct the City Attorney to work with Senator Luechtefeld and State Representative Dan Reitz to draft the False Alarm Assessment Bill providing a fee structure for repetitive false alarms reported to police and fire departments of non-home rule units of government, and to proceed with drafting an ordinance for the Council to review. Upon Roll Call vote, Aldermen Conrad, Ebersohl, Agne, Niemietz, Unnerstall, Koesterer, Row, Huch, and Mayor Hutchinson voted yea. Motion Carried.

It was moved by Alderman Ebersohl, and seconded by Alderman Niemietz, to accept the report of the City Attorney as presented. Upon Voice vote, all Aldermen present voted yea. Motion Carried.

G. City Clerk

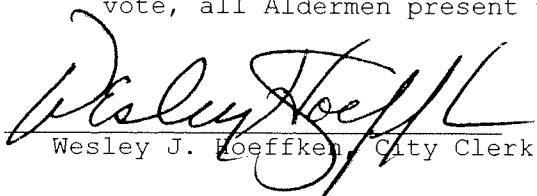

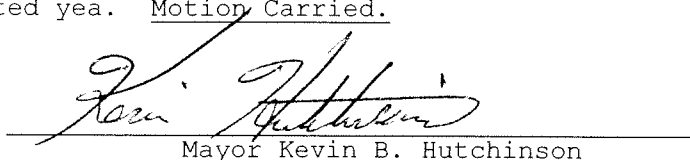
Mayor Hutchinson inquired if there was any business to be brought before the Council as a result of the Executive Session. There was none.
